Radio DJ: Many people are still unsure about the difference between HIV and AIDS and some people talk about taking the 'AIDS Test' when in fact it is the test for HIV. To help clear up the confusion we spoke to Alan Ross from the Scottish AIDS Monitor who explains the difference.

Alan Ross: Now, HIV is the virus that causes AIDS (Human Immunodeficiency Virus). So, HIV is the virus that causes AIDS. Somebody can be carrying the virus and not be ill at all. AIDS is actually when somebody has become ill.

Radio DJ: Having a steady relationship and being faithful to your partner is one way of preventing the spread of the HIV virus. Dr Judy Greenwood talked to us about the importance of communication in maintaining a health and long term relationship.

Dr Greenwood: In the past people may have had the odd flirtation with someone else, and now people are not very happy about doing that because HIV, and rightly so. I think one night stands are very dangerous things. But there are lots of ways that people can keep their sex lives going. I mean, first of all they should be talking to each other and finding out if it is good for both of them, and if it's not, what can be done differently. I certainly think that people should be asking a bit more of the sort of things that they like and perhaps in their fantasies that they'd like. Getting their partner to do that, as long in exchange you do nice things for him.
